

### Church Wardens play a very important role in the running of the parish

- 16.1. Churchwardens are wholly responsible:
  - (a) to provide all things necessary for the efficient running of the Ministry Unit and the administration of the sacraments and rites of the Church;
  - (b) to provide regular financial reports to the Ministry Unit Council (The Churchwardens may appoint a Treasurer to assist them.);
  - (c) to inform the Ministry Unit Council of any unexpected expenditure;
  - (d) for all moneys belonging to the Ministry Unit and to keep a proper record thereof;
  - (e) to pay all stipends, expenses and allowances, Diocesan assessments and other accounts when due, giving priority to the payment of stipends;
  - (f) to secure the written approval of the Diocesan Executive before incurring any liability by way of mortgage, overdraft or loan (secured or otherwise) for the purchase, maintenance or improvement of property, or for any general purpose whatsoever;
  - (g) to ensure that all church property within the Ministry Unit is regularly inspected and maintained in good condition, including:
    - (i) carrying out an examination of all buildings within the Ministry Unit by a suitably qualified person, approved by the Diocesan Council, every five years; and
    - (ii) forwarding the report from the inspection, together with a timetable of necessary works, to the Diocesan Registrar;
  - (h) to ensure that all church property is adequately insured throughout the Ministry Unit in accordance with current regulations;
  - (i) to preserve good order and quiet in and about the church during Divine Service;
  - (j) to provide adequate access to Ministry Unit buildings and grounds, where possible;
  - (k) to ensure Workplace Health and Safety regulations are complied with;
  - (I) to ensure that worship aids are provided where necessary;
  - (m) to report to the Bishop any irregularity in the conduct of the Incumbent;
  - (n) to attend the Bishop or the Bishop's Commissary or the Archdeacon whenever cited to a visitation, or on the Bishop's visit to the Ministry Unit;
  - (o) to report immediately to the Bishop the vacancy of the Ministry Unit from death or otherwise; and
  - (p) to hand over to their successors in office the control of all moneys and church property under their control.
- 16.2. Churchwardens in cooperation with the Incumbent are responsible to:
  - (a) maintain and securely store, all registers, rolls and records, and to ensure that accurate minutes are made and retained of all Ministry Unit Council meetings;
  - (b) meet regularly, and at least once each quarter, with each other to discuss and promote the spiritual and other needs of the Ministry Unit;
  - (c) ensure that all activities of the Ministry Unit are in compliance with the safe ministry policies and procedures as set out in Faithfulness in Service;
  - (d) ensure that all Diocesan returns are completed and are forwarded to the Diocesan Registry on time;
  - (e) have the control of all ornamentation and decoration of the church subject to the Canons and Regulations of the Diocese;
  - (f) prepare an annual budget for presentation to the Ministry Unit Council.

# Lent 4 Mothering Sunday

- Mothering Sunday is also known Simnel Sunday due to the tradition of baking Simnel cakes to celebrate the 'family reunion' during the austerity of Lent.
- Simnel cake is a light fruit cake, **similar to a Christmas cake**, covered in marzipan.
- It has been eaten since medieval times as both a rich, sweet treat and a symbolic ritual. The fruit cake is topped with eleven marzipan balls to represent the eleven apostles of Christ, minus Judas.

### MOTHERING SUNDAY

Simnel Sunday, or Mothering Sunday as it is more commonly called, was traditionally the time when apprentices and 'live-in' servants went home to visi their mother church and worship with their families, bringing with them gifts of flowers and the traditional 'Simnel

cake'. It is thought that the cake derived its name from the rine white flour or 'simila' which was used for special baking

There are three traditional kinds of Simnel Cake - the starshaped 'Devizes Simnel'; the Bury Simnel, a flat spiced cake; and the Shrewsbury Simnel, with a layer of marzipan in the centre and eleven or twelve marzipan eggs on top.

### SHREWSBURY STYLE SIMNEL CAKE

1 caps plain flour 1 teaspn salt 1 teaspn each ground allspice and cinnamon 185g butter 1 1/3 cups brown sugar

Z cups currants

Marzipan
24 cups icing sugar
24 cups ground almonds
3 egg yolks

14 cups sultanas
2/3 cup chopped candied peel or
other fruits - figs were
traditional
2/3 cup milk
1 teaspn treacle
2 tablespn apricot jam
1 beaten egg to glaze

2 teaspn lemon juice 1 teaspn almond essence

Cake

3 eggs

Sift flour, salt and spices together. Cream butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Beat in lightly beaten eggs and gradually add to mixture, beating all the time. Fold in flour mixture with the fruit. Heat milk and treacle and cool Add to cake mixture to make a stiff batter. Marzipan
Sift icing sugar and almonds together into a large bowl, make a well in the centre and drop in the lightly beaten egg yolks, a well in the centre and essence. Mix to a stiff paste and lemon juice and almond essence. It is preferable to leave knead until the paste is smooth. It is preferable to leave overnight before rolling out.

Keep a third of the marzipan aside for decoration. Divide remainder in two parts, one smaller piece to fit inside a remainder in two parts, one smaller piece to fit inside a 20cm cake tin, which has been buttered and lined with buttered greaseproof paper. Spoon half the cake mixture into tin and place marzipan on top. Spoon remaining cake mixture over marzipan and bake in a slow oven 150°C for about 3½ hours. Cool slightly and turn out to cool completely on wire rack. Brush top with a little warmed apricot jam.

Roll out the second part of marzipan into another 20cm circle and place on top of the cake. Mark top into small squares with a sharp knife. Cut reserved marzipan into 11 pieces and roll into small balls. Place the marzipan balls around the edge of the cake and completely brush the top with beaten egg. Place cake in a hot oven or under a grill for a few minutes to toast.

Note: Three 210g packets of bought marzipan can be used instead of making your own marzipan.








Bishop Keith will conduct a Patronal Service followed by a *BYO food to share* supper





On the right are the Regimental Colours of the 3lst Battalion. On the left are the King's Own Colours for this regiment.


Recently, we have had a number of enquiries about the Regimental Colours.

There is a photo of the colours hanging in the Cathedral in 2000 and by 2011 they have disappeared. Does anyone have any idea what happened to them?


The Regimental and King's Colours of the Kennedy Regiment once hung here, but are now in the Australian War Museum, Canberra.














# Support for Ukraine runs deep

**JOHN ANDERSEN** looks at the war in Ukraine, speaks with a Bulletin reporter on the ground and delves deeper into the mind of a cattle baron.

BOB from Townsville sent me this message during the week: "Last night we went to the Civic Theatre for the Barrier Reef Orchestra performance of A Feast of Classics. After the interval, guest conductor Patrick Pickett announced that the orchestra would play the Ukrainian National Anthem. The orchestra then stood and commenced to play this rousing anthem.

"Immediately everyone in the audience stood while the anthem played. Anyone there couldn't help but be moved and on completion the audience responded enthusiastically." Bravo Townsville! (Patrick Pickett spent 37 years in the army and when he retired was a lieutenant colonel and commander of the Defence Force School of Music).

THE bulk carrier SMEW registered in Cyprus tied up at Berth 8 at the Port of Townsville last week. It sailed early this week with its Ukrainian crew for Durban. Graham Miller and helpers from the The Mission to Seafarers down at the port went all-out, expecting the Ukrainian crew would be allowed off the ship. Pizzas were arranged for delivery and phone cards were bought so that the crew could ring loved ones back home in

their war-torn country. The chapel at the mission and the berth itself were draped in the blue and yellow colours of Ukraine. All of this work came crashing down when the vessel's master would not allow the crew to disembark. Two reps from the mission were allowed to take phone cards on board but the skipper, bizarrely, said "no" to any pizzas being brought on to his ship.

At least the crew got to try to call loved ones, but it must have been heartbreaking for those who just listened to the phone ring out at the other end or simply got no ringtone at all. The phone cards were provided by the Australian Mariners Welfare Society and Townsville fruit and vegie supplier, Simon George and Sons. Once again, good on Townsville!

## St James' Cathedral 130th Anniversary October 27th 2022

The cathedral, however, must not be looked upon as for Townsville alone, but as an object of pride to every son and daughter of the church from end to end of North. Queensland. The hour of opening had necessarily, in conformation to the rules of the church, been fixed at an hour which was not very convenient to all, but he rejoiced to see so large a congregation on the occasion.

He had received a letter from Bishop Stanton a day or two ago, who spoke with regret that he could not personally be present at the opening ceremony, but he had said "My heart and thoughts will be with you on

Thursday." Going on, Bishop Barlow reverted to over 20 years ago, when he had rejoiced upon the opening of the limited building which had supplied their wants from then up till now. He noticed some around who had been present upon that occasion, and he feelingly spoke also of the number then present who

had since passed away for ever. He concluded by inviting the congregation to join in the partaking of the Holy Communion. The choir sang hymn No. 360 during the offertory, the letter resulting in the collection of over £182.
