Service set for **Prince Philip**


A TRADITIONAL **Anglican Evensong will** be held at the St James **Cathedral on Monday** night in honour of Prince Philip. In a statement, the **Anglican Diocese of North Queensland** remembered the Prince as a faithful member of the Church of England, and it will




Mess Margaret White, sister of Archdeacon White, died yesterday. She had been adling for some time. The functal will be held this morning.


The thunderstorm yesterday yielded 98 points of rain; the area was very limited.







PREDICTING the weather has long been a tough task, even for the most seasoned meteorologists, with many residents believing the behaviour of birds holds the key.

But researchers are now looking into the theory that cockatoos are a sign of bad weather on the way, perching themselves in the Townsville University Hospital staff carpark to find out.

James Cook University researchers Lisa Chilton and Orachun Hayakijkosol, alongside internationally renowned bird biologist Dr Glen Chilton, are

can anticipate the approach of a cyclone and make adaptive responses.

Dr Chilton and his team have been observing the behaviour of a large roost of cockatoos in Annandale's Marabou Park for the past three years.

He said six weeks ago numbers at the roost started to fall, leading the team to go looking for where they were now roosting.

"One day I just decided to hop on my bike and go looking for our birds," he said. "I checked all over town and eventually there they were in the staff parking lot at the hospital.

"This year was going to be really

studying the birds to determine if they important because we were supposed to get quite a few cyclones.

"This hasn't happened, so we are just going to have to pick it up again next year."

The research explores why nocturnal communal roosting is important to sulphur-crested cockatoos, identify which gums they like to roost in for the sake of their preservation and if they really have a built-in early warning system for cyclones. During dawn and dusk observation sessions, the team document roost numbers by counting each bird and noting their arrival and departure time.











