




JUNE 11TH ST. BARNABAS

Dedicated to the Brotherhood of St Barnabas 1984.

The Brotherhood of St Barnabas was founded in 1902. In 1919 Sr Alice of St Anne's inspired Bishop Feetham to establish a boy's school in the North and once the finance was gathered the All Souls School in Charters Towers was founded by the Brotherhood with Reginald Halse the first Headmaster in 1920.

JUNE 29TH ST. PAUL


- Given by the Cathedral Chapter in memory of Ethel Mary Green

Ethel Mary Green was born in Charters Towers in 1893 where she spent her early years. She died in Townsville on 4th October 1977. A faithful member of the Cathedral congregation, her abiding interests within the Diocese were the Church Schools, the work of the Sisters of the Society of the Sacred Advent, the Brotherhood of St Barnabas and St James Cathedral. She spent many years of her life involved with the newspaper industry. She and her sister Marjorie checked and proofread the paper due to a lack of manpower during World War II and she was a director of the company for many years.

Miss Ethel Green and Miss Marjorie Green were also editors of "The Northern Churchman" the news sheet of the Diocese of North Queensland. They were appointed to this position by Bp. Wilfred Belcher in 1948.

Minutes of Meeting 5 August 1883

On Sunday evening, August 5. 1883, a meeting of Church to members and others was held in St James' Church to initiate the movement for rasing the necessary funds for the erection of a bathedral Church.

During the day special surmous had been preached with reference to this matter; one in the morning by the Riv. S. H. Child, of St Thomas Church, North Shore, Syoney, and the other in the evening by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese 7 who was more than houally eloquent.

"The memorial to the men will be the completion of St. James' Cathedral, Townsyille. The memorial to the women will be the erection of a new St. Anne's School." (N.C. February 1954,

The fourfold plan as set out in the Synod Charge of August 1953 had become a two-fold plan for the Cathedral and St. Anne's only-both to cost roughly £50,000.

HOW ARE WE TO RAISE £100,000 ?

By prayer and concerted hard work.

On the first Sunday in February a pastoral letter from the Bishop was read in all churches in the Diocese. It was circulated together with prayer-cards which it was hoped would be in use by all Anglicans in the months to come.

Then an appeal was made to the primary producers in the Diocese.

THE CATTLE MEN were asked to brand a few poddie calves with the Bishop's brand at their next branding. The Church couldn't start a cattle station, but with 950 stations in the Diocese and hopefully a few calves branded on each, it would solve the financial problems.

THE SHEEP MEN were asked to give the wool from their black sheep. 'Black sheep' have had a bad name for a long time and there is no better place than the Church for them . . .

THE CANE MEN could fill in the suggested form asking the Sugar Mills to deduct a certain amount per ton of cane crushed (e.g. 1d per ton).

THE CATTLE MEN "will be glad to know that all gifts made to this appeal are Income Tax free, i.e., deductible in accordance with the Income Tax Assessment Act 1936-1946". Then there appeared a chart showing what a contribution for certain taxable incomes would actually cost the donors.

The appeal was launched on the first Sunday in February-7th February! The assaults of a cyclone were also launched that same day thus preventing people from coming to church. Nevertheless, the Bishop ordained that day George Tung Yep as Deacon in the unfinished St. James' Cathedral.

By February 1954 the appeal totals were: Cathedral £239/4/11; St. Anne's School £3,284/17/3; and General £36/9/-.


CATHEDRAL CONSECRATION JUNE 24^{TH,} 1978




