For each and every call.



Tuesday 18th October - Wontulp-Bi-Buya followed by a relaxed visit to the rainforest.



Our link with Canterbury Cathedral

- On the wall near St Augustine's Chapel is a metal Cross set on stone. This Cross is known as the Canterbury Cross.
- A cross exactly like this one and dating from the Eighth Century was found beneath a street in the City of Canterbury. Replicas of the Cross, mounted on fragments of stone from Canterbury Cathedral itself, have been placed in Cathedrals in all parts of the world where they are valued as links binding them to the Mother Church of the Anglican Communion. Our cross forms just such a link.


Anglican Prayer Beads

The Anglican form of this rosary style prayer method came out of a contemplative prayer group that met in the mid 1980's. The thirty-three bead design was created by the Rev. Lynn Bauman.

The use of the Prayer Beads encourages contemplative prayer by bringing our whole self into prayer – body, mind, and spirit. The pressure of our fingers on the beads helps to keep our mind from wandering and the rhythm of the prayers leads us into stillness.

The Structure of Anglican Prayer Beads

The Invitatory Bead just above the Cross is an invitation to praise and worship God much like the Invitatory (opening psalm) of the Daily Office. The Invitatory Bead is an entry point into the circle of prayer.



The four **Cruciform Beads** remind us that the Cross is the central symbol of Christian faith. They also symbolize the seasons of the solar year (spring, summer, fall, and winter) and the four points on the compass, bringing to mind the created worlds.

The Weeks are the four groups of seven beads. The Weeks remind us of the days of Creation, the temporal week, the seasons of the Church year (Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Holy Week, Easter, and Pentecost) and the seven Sacraments (Holy Eucharist, Baptism, Confirmation, Ordination, Holy Matrimony, Reconciliation of a Penitent, and Unction). The number seven also signifies wholeness or completion.

VISITING SEAFARERS



On the eve of our Cathedral Festival, at 11.30 p.m., a fire was discovered in one of the crypt vestries. A passerby noticed the flickering flames and ran to the Deanery to report the occurrence. The Dean immediately rang the Fire Brigade and by the time he had run down to the Cathedral the Brigade had arrived and very soon had the fire under control and extinguished. We are very grateful to the Townsville Fire Brigade for their promptness and the expedition with which they carried out their work.

A large cupboard was destroyed in the blaze, and its contents also. It contained the new robes for the Lay Canons which were used only once at the last Synod.

The next morning, before the services, it was discovered that a decanter of wine, set out in the sanctuary for the principal Masses, had been consumed and one or two cigarette butts were stamped into the floor near the credence table.


This occurrence, following on the desecration in April of the Cathedral wall and steps with obscure painted messages, quite disheartened the Cathedral clergy and people, and we can only hope that there will be no further happenings of this nature.

Vandalism and desecration of churches have been increasing over the past years, and have caused many of our churches, which have remained open 24 hours a day for the benefit and solace of all people, to be closed.

Just recently, a quantity of wine was also found to be missing from our daughter church of S. Mark, Belgian Gardens. Now this church, which has remained unlocked will have to be closed when not in use.

Work has commenced on renovations in the Cathedral. Windows and glass panelling have been cracked beyond repair; wood partitions and a table have been extensively scorched, and walls and ceilings of the vestries severely smoke-blackened. The cost for renovation has been assessed at approximately \$1700.
