

# November 2<sup>nd</sup>

## All Souls' Day



All Souls' Day is an annual Christian feast day, to commemorate those who have died but are believed to be in purgatory. All Souls' Day has been tradition since the 11<sup>th</sup> Century and is dedicated to prayer for souls which are believed to be marked by lesser sins, in order to purify them for heaven.

All Souls' School for boys was established by the Bush Brotherhood of St Barnabas in 1920 as a memorial school to the fallen of the First World War.

St Gabriel's School for girls was established in 1921 by the Sisters of the Society of Sacred Advent.

Throughout the remainder of the twentieth century, the two schools provided an education for the children of northern Australia. Both schools became known for their ability to produce self-reliant and independent young men and women.

The old latin motto *cui servire est regnare* translates as **"to serve is to reign"**.


The year 2022 marks 30 years since the Anglican Church in Australia (narrowly) agreed in November 1992 that women could be ordained priest.

Ironically, there were already twelve women who were priests. Ten had been ordained in Perth by Archbishop Peter Carnley on 7 March, the Feast Day of Perpetua AND International Women's Day. Ironically one of them, Kay Goldsworthy, now Archbishop of Perth, was a member of that General Synod!

Two other women had been ordained elsewhere: Caroline Pearce and Dawn Kenyon (assistant priest in Maryborough Vic where Kennedys worshipped in 1980s, after being ordained in New Zealand).





# November 16<sup>th</sup> St Margaret of Scotland

(c. 1045 – 1093)

St Margaret was born in 1045 in Hungary, in exile from England, and in 1170 she married King Malcom III of Scotland. Margaret was a just queen, who strongly influenced the King, the court and the church. She was a holy woman, renowned for her charitable works to orphans and the poor. She died in 1093 and was canonised in 1250. There is a charming window of St Margaret in St James.



## A feast for St. Cecilia

It may be a cliché but a concert held in St James' Cathedral on the evening of Saturday 21st November was very much a "sound and light spectacular". This was perhaps fitting as the concert was held to celebrate the Feast of Saint Cecilia, the Patron Saint of Music and Musicians.

The lighting encompassed everything from candles illuminating the music for the Band of the First Battalion Royal Australian Regiment to the full blaze of spotlights provided by the Creative Arts Department at James Cook University. Musically there was everything from the baroque to modern with the use of fanfare trumpets, voice, string, the Cathedral organ and so on to tuned beer bottles.

The concert was excellently led by Captain Gregg Amies, Music Director of the Band of the First Battalion Royal Australian Regiment, who, sadly, is

leaving us for a position with the Defence Force School of Music in Victoria.

The concert commenced in the gallery for the organ in St James' Cathedral with the Army trumpeters using their fanfare trumpets to perform a spectacular fanfare heralding the National Anthem. The evening closed with a lone bugler playing the Last Post in the darkened Cathedral whilst organ and band accompanied him with the hymn tune "Finlandia" (Be still my soul).

The greatest applause seemed to be reserved for Elgar's Pomp and Circumstance March played with gusto by band and organ together but there were many exciting and interesting elements during the course of the evening. The evening was not without a sense of humor - immediately before interval, the band played "Hayden's Farewell Sym-

phony" and gradually members of the band got up and abandoned Gregg Amies until, ultimately, there were just two left. Much mirth greeted the performance of a surprise piece ably narrated by David Lloyd. Special mention should be made of the Kirwan High School String Ensemble who appeared as guest artists and the Reverend Norton Challenor who reminded us of his skills as a baritone during the singing of "The trumpet shall sound" from the 'Messiah'.

The concert ably demonstrated the greater variety of musical endeavour that can now occur in the Cathedral following the restoration of the Cathedral organ and the building of the new gallery.

The concert was also a financial success with \$2,500 being raised for the Organ Restoration Fund.



# November 25<sup>th</sup>

---

James Noble (1876?-1941), **Aboriginal clergyman**, was reputedly born in 1876 near Boulia, North Queensland, of parents from Normanton. In the early 1890s he was a stockman for the Doyle brothers at Riversleigh on the Gregory River, and was taken south to Invermien, their station near Scone, New South Wales. On 13 September 1925 he was made deacon at St George's Cathedral, Perth, before returning to Forrest River. Thus he became the first Aboriginal Anglican clergyman in Australia.

- We pray for the people of Poruma (Coconut) Island and other Torres Strait islands who are facing the issue of rising sea levels. Poruma Island is a coral cay in the Torres Strait, approximately 1.4 km long with a width of about 400 m.

The foundation stone of the Church of St Andrews was laid in 1926 .

There was no expertise when it came to the construction of the church of St Andrews. The church was never completed because cracks started to appear in the walls when the bell tower was being added.

The walls were far too thin, had no steel reinforcing and shell grit was used as aggregate; not sound building practice, when building on a sand island.

## ICON TURNING 130

TOWNSVILLE'S St James Cathedral in Denham St is about to celebrate 130 years since the opening of its first part in October 27 1892.

It was a hard road building such a magnificent structure.

Although work started all those years ago, the cathedral itself wasn't completed until 1960 after a major fund-raising effort was undertaken.

The 950 station owners in the Diocese were encouraged to donate the fleece from their black sheep to the cause and beef cattle growers branded calves "for the cathedral".

Sugarcane farmers weren't let off the hook and were asked to donate a percentage from each tonne of cane harvested.

A classy looking enamel car badge was given to those who donated 100 pounds sterling or more.

The cathedral would love to get their hands on one of the badges if there are any still around.

An album with more than 80 wedding photos has been produced and will be on exhibit.

There will be a dinner, concerts and tours of the cathedral to celebrate the milestone.







# Archbishop's 2022 November Appeal

Newton Theological College,  
Papua New Guinea



Newton Theological College in Oro Province is where the Anglican Church of Papua New Guinea trains its ordinands for priesthood.

The College community comprises about 90 people, including staff, 12 on-campus students, and their families. An additional nine students are undertaking a bridging course.

While the students receive theological formation, their spouses also receive training in basic literacy, Bible and theology, sewing, cooking and healthcare. Spouses both share in their husbands' ministry and have distinct ministries of their own.

A key challenge for the College is to meet new government requirements in curriculum, administration, and infrastructure.

Several buildings have already been improved, and a health clinic and nurse's house are being renovated.
