

## DEDICATION OF ETHEL GREEN MEMORIAL

On Sunday, 24th August, at 9.00 a.m. the Ethel Green Memorial was dedicated in the Cathedral Church of St. James by the Bishop of North Queensland, the Right Reverend John Lewis, S.S.M., and the Dean of Townsville, the Very Revd. D. E. H. Philp. Present at the service was Miss Marjorie Green, the surviving sister of Ethel and Nancy.

The memorial consists of a very attractive mosaic, designed and produced by Mr. Stan Moses of Atherton, and it certainly enhances the Cathedral Church. It has been installed in the southern transept above the doorway, and portrays our Lord and the twelve Apostles. In the central panel are the crests and insignias of Jesus, James and John, Peter and Andrew. These are supported by two further panels, which carry the crests and insignias of the other eight Apostles. It does enhance the Cathedral and makes the great southern door a pleasing aspect.

The late Ethel Mary Green departed this life on Tuesday, 4th October, 1977 and was buried from the Cathedral Church, where she was a regular worshipper for over sixty years. She was born in Charters Towers in 1893 and came to Townsville in 1911 with the family to live. Like her sisters she took a lively interest in the Church Schools and the work of the Brotherhood of St. Barnabas. Furthermore, Ethel and the family were great supporters of the Bishopric and gave much encouragement to Bishops of North Queensland, particularly Blessed John Oliver Feetham. Her family are remembered and will continue to be remembered in the Diocese in many ways, but when we look at the mural in the Cathedral we will think especially of Ethel and thank God for her life, her ministry, and her devotion to God, family, and the northern community.

# History of the Camino de Santiago

Thousands of people walk the [Camino de Santiago](#) every year. Originally, however, the Camino was responsible for one of the largest movements of people across Europe.

Pilgrims made the long journey to the magnificent cathedral in Galicia's Santiago de Compostela, in north-west Spain. Camino de Santiago, translates in English as the Way of Saint James. Santiago or Sant Iago means Saint James.

## The Legend of Saint James

According to the pilgrimage's official history, the body of Saint James the Apostle is buried in Santiago's cathedral. The body of James, son of Zebedee and brother of John the Evangelist, was discovered in a field in Galicia by a shepherd named Pelayo in the 9th century, during the reign of King Alfonso II.


Saint James had died some 800 years earlier and according to legend, was transported to Galicia (to the town of Iria Flavia, today's Padrón, found on the Camino Portugues) by two disciples in a boat led by angels. Somehow his body was then buried in a field not far from there, the very place where it would be discovered a few centuries later.

Informed about this important discovery, King Alfonso II had a small chapel built in this holy place. He would later commission a larger temple in order to attract pilgrims from all over the world. This would, in effect, compete with other important religious centres of pilgrimage, such as Jerusalem and Rome.

Of course, at this point in time, religious buildings across Europe were all busy competing for the best relics in order to attract as many pilgrims as possible. The relics of Saint James would transform Santiago de Compostela into one of the world's most important pilgrimage destinations



## How They Began

Dr Digby and Anne Hoyal lived and worked in Tansen Mission Hospital in Western Nepal for 5 years until 2004 as a doctor-nurse team, treating the poorest of the poor and training local medical staff. When they began carrying bags of rice to a family living under a sheet of tin at the hospital wall, they started a relationship which would develop into a warm extended 'family' from which Nepali Family Incorporated was born.

Prior to their return to North Queensland in 2004, the Hoyals began a charity to assist the most vulnerable in those communities. Built upon solid relationships, the charity has resolutely retained its small scale, preferring to achieve real successes at the local level rather than broad-scale handouts.

Some of the children supported by the charity in its early days now form the in-country support committee and are mentoring and building opportunities for the next generation.

The Opening

I was waiting in line for a ride at the airport. When a cab pulled up, the first thing I noticed was the taxi was polished to a bright shine. He handed me a laminated card and said, 'I'm Wasu, your driver. While I'm loading your bags in the trunk, I'd like you to read my mission statement.' Taken aback, I read the card.
