## ARCHDEACON GEORGE TUNG YEP

Fr. Tung Yep, a name and face well-known over the length and breadth of the Diocese of North Queensland, has now returned to his home city of Cairns. He has taken up the position as Rector of St. John's Parish and Archdeacon of the Northern Region of the Diocese of North Queensland.

Fr. Tung Yep has an extremely interesting and varied background and, to his knowledge, he is the only Australian-born Chinese Anglican priest in Australia.

He was born in Cairns in 1927 and lived there until 1950, when he left to complete his theological training at St. Francis' College in Brisbane.

Fr. Tung Yep's parents were born in China and migrated to Cairns before the turn of the century.

"As a young man, my father came to Cairns to conduct a general store," Fr. Tung Yep said.

"It was a family business until about 1953, and occupied the position where Rusty Rees is now situated in Grafton Street.

"My parents were Taoists and my beginnings in worship were at the joss house situated in Sachs Street—the old Chinatown in Cairns.

"Sachs Street was renamed Grafton Street," he said.

"I was 11 when my mother died and I could not continue my religious practices because my mother used to guide me.

Bishop George served in the Diocese of North Queensland from 1954 to 1995. He was the first Chinese-Australian bishop, serving as assistant bishop from 1985 to 1995.

Bishop Tung Yep was born in 1927 and he left school in 1941 to become an apprentice boiler-maker with the Queensland Railways. At 16, he left to help in the family business. In 1951, he went to study Theology at St Francis College, Brisbane.





# February 21<sup>st</sup> – Shrove Tuesday

The name, Shrove Tuesday, comes from the practice of confessing one's sins on that day, of being shriven in preparation for the season of penance to come.

In many parts of the world, especially in olden times, people had a great deal else on their minds on Shrove Tuesday, that is, a great deal on the subject of food.

In pre-Reformation times in English towns the church bell was rung on Shrove Tuesday and came to be known as the "shriving bell." This in time was called the "pancake bell," so closely identified was the day with that article of food.

*Pancakes and fritters, Say the bells of Saint Peter's,  
Hark I hear the pancake bell  
And fritters make a gallant smell.*



Puritans regarded the pancakes as merely one more popish dish and came out against it. One feature of the custom should have pleased their economical souls, since the pancakes used up all the fat in the household, as at that time none could be used for the next six weeks.

The first 3 pancakes were always set aside “*One for Peter, two for Paul and three for He who made us all*”



Story-based studies that will touch your heart, build your faith and encourage you on the missional journey. All genuine mission is incarnational and relationally based. As the studies suggest, *“If our mission is all about purpose rather than relationship, we miss the point.”*

St Andrew's was built in 1964. Built of concrete and steel, it is an architect's wonder with its wide span and no internal supports. It measures 18.5m x 14m and features four stained glass windows in memory of Fr Ernie Lemmon and the Revd Dr David Harvey Sutton (both non-stipend ministers) and their wives. The Revd Dr David visited many grazing properties to secure funding for St Andrew's. Fr Ernie was minister in charge from 1984 when our only stipend minister left. Before that we were cared for by the Bush Brothers, of whom Bishop Frodsham of Oxford wrote "O for a band of men that will preach like Apostles, ride like cowboys, and having food and raiment, therefore be content". This band of men became the Bush Brothers who overcame vast distances to serve the bush people from 1903. Cloncurry was one of their original outposts. St Andrew's is now supported by Bush Church Aid.






