

31st BATTALION (The Kennedy Regiment) The Royal Queensland Regiment

We welcome Members of the 31st **Battalion, Kennedy Regiment**

August 18th





A small detachment of the Queensland Volunteer Artillery Brigade, known as No. 4 Battery was raised on 12th June 1878. When inspected by Lt. Colonel Blaxland in 1880, the detachment comprised 40 members.

In 1885, a local militia and artillery corps was formed in Townsville as part of the Northern Military District. Other units had also been formed at Rockhampton, Blackall, Port Curtis, Mackay, Bowen, Charters Towers, Ravenswood, Cairns and Hughenden.

Volunteers from Rifle Companies at Charters Towers, Ravenswood and Townsville provided the beginning of the 3rd Queensland or **Kennedy Regiment**, formally gazetted as part of the Queensland Defence force on 15th December 1886. Major William Vincent Slade was its first commanding officer.

By 1899, the Regiment's numbers had grown considerably, leading to the division of the regiment into two Battalions - A Company (Charters Towers & Ravenswood) and B Company (Townsville, Cairns & Mackay). By 1892, approximately 750 infantry and mounted infantry were based at Kissing Point, Townsville.

When the call came for volunteers to serve with Her Majesty's Army in South Africa (Boer War), many members of the 3rd Queensland Regiment were selected as part of the first and second contingents of the Queensland Mounted Infantry between 1899-1902.

Known as the Kennedy Regiment 1st Battalion in 1903, the unit's headquarters were still in Townsville, comprising 5 companies with 2 detached companies at Mackay. After universal military training was introduced in 1912, the unit was redesignated 2nd Infantry, Kennedy Regiment.

In the years that followed the unit trained to live up to its motto:

"SEMPER PERATUS DEFENDRE -ALWAYS READY TO DEFEND"



31" Battalion Kennedy Regiment 1919 - 1943

The Defence act first passed in 1901 allowed for militia forces to be raised for the defence of Australia. These forces were mainly a volunteer force, however occasionally, in times of national emergency; these forces were supplemented with conscription of some sort.

The threat of Japan in 1939 saw the reintroduction of Compulsory Military Service and as a result the North Queensland militia; 31 battalion of North Queensland and 51st battalion of Far North Queensland were supplemented with extra men in the form of the 1939 call up.

The Defence act at the time specified that these forces were too used only for the defence of Australia on Australian soil, and as a result these units were initially stationed in North Queensland performing garrison duties, investigating reports of Japanese landings and training and preparing for the Japanese invasion.

Initially these two battalions joined the 26th battalion to form the 11th brigade in the North. The brigade headquarters was in Townsville with the 31st in Townsville, the 51st in Cairns and the 26th in Charters Towers

Who was called to service?

North Queensland's Kennedy Regiment was located in Military District One. It was the first regiment called to service to defend Australia.

Officers throughout north Queensland alerted the troops to make ready for departure. Charters Towers supplied the bulk of the infantry, 200 of them, with 12 officers, but the three metropolitan companies, were still considered under strength.

To increase numbers, the Kennedy Regiment was joined by men who formed part of the Citizen's Forces. These men were aged between 18 and 60, and were from north Queensland's rifle clubs. Although not trained soldiers, they too had to leave professions, farms, businesses, mining claims and families. However, the Citizen's Force was only required to fight on the home front, not overseas.

Marcia's Champion Bakewell Tart

1 ½ c plain flour
2 tablespoon icing sugar
100g (3 ½ ozs. Butter)
1 egg, lightly beaten
pinch salt

Base

1. Sift dry ingredients into a bowl, rub butter thru with fingertips.

- 2. Add egg & work it thru mixture
- 3. Knead into a workable dough.
- 4. Refrigerate for 30 minutes.

5. Roll pastry out to fit a 24inch fluted, loose bottomed tart plate, prick in several places with a fork,

6. Line with baking paper, add weights(uncooked rice)bake at 180°C for 15 minutes.

7. Remove weights and baking paper and give another 5 minutes in the oven. Cool





Filling 150g butter (5 oz) 150 g castor sugar (3/4 c) 3 eggs at room temperature 150g almond meal Finely grated zest of a lemon Strawberry jam Flaked almonds

- 1. Beat butter & sugar together till pale,
- 2. Add eggs 1 at a time,
- 3. Add the almond meal & zest.
- 4. Spread jam over the base of the tart then spoon over the filling
- 5. Evenly and sprinkle flaked almonds across the surface.
- 6. Bake at 180°C, 35-40 minutes till golden, risen and set. Cool in the tin.



Cathedra Coat of Arms

Bishopric of North Queensland, which was granted on 6 May 1954

(College of Arms Grants 116/52).



Arms belongs to the father of Bishop John Oliver Feetham (<u>College of Arms Grants</u> <u>78/253</u>;). granted on 6 January 1909

The Arms shows leopards' faces either side of a diagonal stripe on which are three 'fylfots' (the same shape as a swastika, which was a traditional heraldic symbol).

The Friends of St James Cathedral have just investigated the Coat of Arms on the Cathedra. Research by the College of Arms in London has found the above information

The College of Arms is the official heraldic authority for England, Wales, Northern Ireland and much of the Commonwealth including Australia and New Zealand.

As well as being responsible for the granting of new coats of arms, the College maintains registers of arms, pedigrees, genealogies, Royal Licences, changes of name, and flags. The heralds, besides having ceremonial duties, advise on all matters relating to the peerage and baronetage, precedence, honours and ceremonial as well as national and community symbols including flags. https://www.college-of-arms.gov.uk/
