Join us in 16 Days of activism against gender-based violence 24 November to 10 December

The 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence was started by activists at the inauguration of the Women's Global Leadership Institute in 1991.

Three decades on, the <u>16 Days of Activism</u> <u>against Gender-Based Violence</u> against Gender-Based Violence is a widely recognised global campaign that encourages action to end gender-based violence.

During the 16 Days, organisations and individuals around the world raise awareness that men's violence against women in a fundamental violation of human rights.

THE 16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM IS...

MEN'S VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

The <u>United Nations</u> defines violence against women as "any act of gender-based violence that causes or could cause physical, sexual or psychological harm or suffering to women, including threats of harm or coercion, in public or in private life."

DRIVERS OF MEN'S VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

There are four factors that <u>evidence has shown</u> <u>can drive men's violence</u> <u>against women</u>. These are referred to as the gendered drivers of men's violence against women:

- 1. Condoning of violence against women. For example, blaming a woman for not leaving a violent partner.
- Men's control of decision-making and limits to women's independence in public and private life. For example, the belief that men should be 'in charge' in their relationships and the bosses at work.
- Rigid gender stereotyping and dominant forms of masculinity. For example, the idea that men must be tough and in charge, and that women should be submissive to men.
- Male peer relations and culture of masculinity that emphasise aggression, dominance and control. For example, men using sexist or homophobic jokes to bond with each other.

December 2nd Frances "Fanny" Perry (<u>née</u> Cooper) 1814–1892

Frances was born in <u>Yorkshire, England</u> and migrated with her husband <u>Charles Perry</u> to <u>Melbourne, Australia</u> in 1848. Frances Perry was a philanthropist and community worker committed to the work of the church, morality^[1] and a focus on women's welfare.^[2] She was the chair of the committee that founded the <u>Melbourne Lying-in (Royal</u> <u>Women's) Hospital</u>,^[3] and was its first president from 1856 to 1874.^[2] She also had leading roles in the Governesses' Home, the Carlton Refuge, and was the first President of the Melbourne Orphan Asylum.^[4]



December 30th Josephine Butler

Josephine Elizabeth Butler (<u>née</u> Grey; 13 April 1828 – 30 December 1906) was an English <u>feminist</u> and <u>social</u> <u>reformer</u> in the <u>Victorian era</u>.

She campaigned for <u>women's suffrage</u>, the right of women to better education, the end of <u>coverture</u> in British law, the abolition of <u>child prostitution</u>, and an end to <u>human trafficking</u> of young women and children into <u>European prostitution</u>.
