

The Naming and Circumcision of Jesus

January 1st Secular customs in connection with the beginning of the New Year usually overshadow the religious observance of the feast. In the Middle Ages they eagerly seized upon any event that afforded a reasonable excuse for a banquet or feasting. On "Newyere Daie" in medieval England the country folk after copious repasts drank each other's health in cups of wassail.

Wassail Bowl


- Nutmeg Ginger root 500g sugar 3 litres beer 120 ml sherry 3 slices lemon 4 slices toast
 - 1. Grate a little nutmeg & some ginger root over sugar
 - 2. Add 1 litre of beer and then sherry
 - 3. Add lemon slices and finally the rest of the beer.
 - 4. Stir, taste, add more sugar if necessary.
 - 5. Serve in a bowl and float the toast on top.



THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD

January 6th

The Epiphany of the Lord celebrates Jesus' manifestation to the world, and the adoration of Jesus by the Magi, or the three kings



January 6th

The Twelfth Day cake is baked and eaten in many lands.

In France the "Galette des Rois" is cut carefully so that there will be one more piece than there are guests at the table. This, called "la part de Dieu," goes to the first poor person who comes to the door.

In Greece this is a double feast day for it is also that of Saint Basil, and the first piece of cake is cut for Christ, the next for Our Lady, and the third for Saint Basil.



At Drury Lane Theatre in London a custom prevailed called "cutting the Baddeley Cake." A comedian of that name left the provision in his will that on each Twelfth Night the performers at the theatre be served cake and wine from the interest of a fund he bequeathed for that purpose. So each year the cake was cut with great ceremony on the 12 stage.

January 10th William Laud archbishop of Canterbury

(7 October 1573 – 10 January 1645)


He was a bishop in the Church of England . Appointed Archbishop of Canterbury by Charles 1 in1633, Laud was a key advocate of Charles1's religious reforms ;

he was arrested by Parliament in 1640 and executed towards the end of the Frist Civil War in January 1645.

January 21: Feast of St. Agnes

Agnes means lamb. In Rome on this feast day two lambs are blessed, and the wool from these lambs are used in making the pallium, the symbols archbishops wear as sign of their authority. Included is a beautiful prayer for St. Agnes. St. Agnes is a wonderful saint for teen-agers because she remained innocent amid pagan corruption and died at thirteen rather than sully herself. Rome still keeps the marked path that she trod to martyrdom. St. Agnes, like St. Valentine, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Anthony of Padua, is invoked by single women in search of a husband -- and today is a good day to pray such a prayer. In fact, Medieval folklore says that on St. Agnes Eve, girls are often granted visions of their future husbands. Scottish girls would meet in a crop field at midnight, throw grain onto the soil, and pray:



Agnes sweet and Agnes fair, Hither, hither, now repair; Bonny Agnes, let me see

Saint Agnes, who's to lovers kind Come ease the trouble of my mind.






Thomas Aquinas

Vanuatu Earthquake Appeal

23/12/24 UPDATE Earthquakes continue to rock Vanuatu, with the death toll rising to 16. The first earthquake was the strongest (magnitude 7.3), striking Vanuatu's capital city, Port Vila, on 17 December. Further earthquakes have followed almost every day, including another strong earthquake (magnitude 6.1) on 22 December. Communities and government authorities are working to restore water supplies, electricity services, bridges and communications systems on the worst hit Island, Efate, while also treating the injured and searching for missing people. **ABM AID's partner organisation, the Anglican Church of Melanesia (ACOM), has begun distributing food and water to affected families on Efate Island, as well as providing psycho-social support. ABM AID has already sent AUD \$15,000 from our rapid response funds to support ACOM Vanuatu's relief efforts.**




