

# Dietrich Bonhoeffer

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a German pastor and theologian known for his opposition to National Socialism. His ties to the July 20, 1944, conspiracy to overthrow the Nazi regime led to his execution in 1945. His theological writings are regarded as classics throughout the Christian world.

He was one of the earliest critics of the Nazi regime, Bonhoeffer became involved in the Confessing Church, a movement that fought against the nazification of the German Evangelical Church.

During the Nazi era, Bonhoeffer became an important contact for church and ecumenical leaders in the United States and Europe.

He was arrested in 1943 and executed in the Flossenbürg concentration camp in April 1945.



# April 11<sup>th</sup>

## George Selwyn

The archbishop of Canterbury, William Howley, consecrated George Selwyn, bishop of New Zealand on 17 October 1841

Selwyn arrived in Auckland, on 30 May 1842 aboard the brig *Bristolian*. Selwyn's prodigious energy and all-round accomplishments impressed both Māori (whose language he had begun to learn on the passage out) and settler. His first visitation tour took six months, covering about 2,300 miles, one third of which he walked, travelling the balance by ship, horseback, boat and canoe. He became a competent mariner, mastered the art of navigation, and in his small schooner, the *Undine*, undertook coastal passages in ill-charted waters, as well as ocean voyages to Melanesia.

Selwyn established his base at the Church Missionary Society station at the Bay of Islands.

The walk will commence from the Gregory Street Amphitheatre (adjacent to Longboard cafe) and proceed along the footpath to Strand Park.


We will walk around Strand Park then back to the Amphitheatre where there will be several short speeches and music.

# Pink tide, good vibe colours Cluden Park

Dressed the part while running to raise funds

Townsville's Cluden Park was a sea of pink on Saturday for the annual International Women's Day Fun Run.

Participants donned their best pink outfits and took part in the fundraising event put on by one of the state's biggest hospital networks.

The event raises money for Mater Hospital's Chicks in Pink campaign, helping provide support services, new equipment and fund vital breast cancer research for the more than 20,000 women who will be diagnosed with breast cancer this year across Australia.

Those taking part ran, walked or jogged a lap or two of Cluden Park Racecourse with food, drinks, family activities including a jumping castle and face painting and community

stalls also set up to enjoy afterwards.

Event organiser Alistair Baggot said the Townsville event, which was in its third year, had been growing in size each year.

"The first year we had 300 participants, last year we had 500 and this year we had around 800 to 1000 people taking part altogether," he said.

"As the numbers increase the fundraising matches that, the first year we raised \$8000, last year was \$20,000 and this year we have reached just over \$53,000."

He said Townsville residents showed their support and made a day of it with family and friends.


The main fun run, which was set to be held in Brisbane on Sunday, had to be cancelled due to the impacts of Cyclone Alfred.

Just now the street gardens are looking beautiful, the recent rains having brought out the colorings, and given vigorous growth.

With one early devastation, these beds have escaped attacks from the local goats, but a couple of goats were noticed, meandering prospectively past the Post Office to the ferry recently, and no doubt this reconnaissance, will be productive of an early raid, on these beautifully decorative beds. An army of goats proceed along the Strand daily unattended, and their presence is a menace to both public and private flower beds. Within the municipality, goats are a pest, and should be treated as such.

Fortunately, the Strand Park is well fenced. It is simply beautiful just now, a mass of coloring and vigorous growth, but there are several empty spaces in the new avenues, where young trees have been missed. It is a pity fresh trees have not been planted long since, for the others are doing splendidly, and trees planted now will be sadly handicapped. Still, better late than never, and if put in right away, they would get a good start, and add to the beauty of this delightful little park.

The Strand is the natural health resort of Townsville, and a plan should be made, and worked to, with an idea of its beautification and attractiveness.


