Embertide weeks also traditionally became the times set aside for priestly ordinations and thus are considered a time of special prayer for priests and vocations.





### St John the Baptist

• Of all the countries that observe St. John's Day, Latvia alone made it a national holiday, honouring every man or boy named John. Every family held open house, and all visitors were welcomed to a table laden with food and a special sweet beer. Carollers went from door to door and were greeted by the housewife at the door with bread, cheese, and mugs of this beer.



#### **Latvian Rye Bread**

- 300ml lukewarm water
- 2 tsp dark honey
- 2 tsp instant yeast
- 1 ½ c pumpernickel dark rye meal
- 2 tsp salt

- 1 to 2 Tbsp caraway seeds
- 3 Tbsp melted butter
- 3 c all-purpose flour

- Pour the water into a mixing bowl, add 1 tsp of the honey.
- 2. Stir in the yeast and rye meal. Set aside in a warm place for about 20 mins or until bubbly
- 3. Add remaining honey, salt, caraway seeds, butter and all-purpose flour until dough begins to pull away from the sides of the bowl. Cover and let stand for 5 minutes.
- 4. Knead dough until smooth and elastic, about 10 mins. It will remain a little sticky.
- . Shape the dough into a ball and place in a greased bowl, turning to coat, and cover with a towel or greased plastic wrap and let rise in a warm place for about 1 1/2 hours or until doubled.
- 6. When dough has doubled, punch it down & divide in half. Shape each half into an oval and place on a parchment-lined baking sheet.
- 7. Cover with a towel or greased plastic wrap and let rise for about 30 mins
- . Preheat oven to 190°C and bake bread for about 45 mins, or until the crust is dark brown





# VALE Br Robin Warsop BSB 27/09/1929 - 08/05/2025

Br Robin was the last Warden of the Brotherhood of St. Barnabas and the final member of the Anglican Bush Brotherhoods.

His unwavering commitment to his faith and the generations of people he served left an indelible mark on all who knew him. As we mourn his loss, we also celebrate a life well-lived in service to others.

May he rest in peace.




In our Diocese, we mark the death of Br Robin Warsop BSB, who died on the evening of 8<sup>th</sup> May 2025. This is a significant moment for our Diocese and the Anglican Church of Australia, and is worthy of comment even as great changes occur elsewhere in our nation, the world and the church. Br Robin was a legendary figure in North Queensland, and especially in Charters Towers where he had spent almost all of his adult life as a teacher at All Souls and St Gabriels School. He was professed as a lay member of the Brotherhood of St Barnabas in 1949, and in 2019 we celebrated the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of his taking his vows of celibacy, poverty and obedience. Unlike most Bush Brothers he was never released from his vows and stayed faithful until his death.


It might be asked why the passing of a lay teacher from Charters Towers is so important for the national church. The reason is simple: he was the last member of the Bush Brotherhood under vows. With his death comes the end of the Brotherhood of St Barnabas, and with that the Bush Brotherhoods as a whole. The Bush Brotherhoods were a remarkable institution, started in 1897 and working mainly in the Dioceses of Bathurst, Rockhampton, Bunbury, North Queensland and Carpentaria (in what is now the Diocese of The Northern Territory). The Brotherhood of St Barnabas was started in 1902 at Herberton. The Bush Brothers were mainly young priests who served for a number of years before being released and going on to more settled parochial ministry. They were instrumental in the foundation of the Church in the outback of Australia. In the end, the model they pioneered was of less relevance in Australia, and the work was taken on in a different way by bodies such as the Bush Church Aid Society — as we see for example at Cloncurry. However, the model of the Bush Brotherhood directly inspired one of the great missionaries of Melanesia, Charles Elliot Fox, and became the basis of the model for the Melanesian Brotherhood.

So with the passing of Br Robin, also passes the great Bush Brotherhoods. There are still some retired Bush Brothers, who will mourn this greatly. But we give thanks for Br Robin, and we give thanks for the Brotherhood of St Barnabas and all the Bush Brotherhoods. May Br Robin rest in peace and rise in glory, and may the story of the Bush Brotherhoods continue to inspire us.






victims/105273092?utm source= abc news app&utm medium=co ntent shared&utm campaign=ab c news app&utm content=other **THE BELL TOWER** - On 27 August 1901, a magnificent tenor bell, weighing 12 cwt 11 lbs (approximately 635 kilograms), was taken out of bond and delivered to the cathedral site in Townsville. Cast by the same makers as London's Big Ben, the bell bore this inscription:

"Holiness to the Lord – To the glory of God and in memory of Wilson Pedder, Priest, and of Mary his wife – Tibi Gratias Agimus" - (We give thanks to you)

By late 1901 or early 1902, a tall wooden belfry was constructed beside the cathedral to house the bell. Designed to stand high above the roofline, the tower allowed the bell's sound to carry as far as Hermit Park and Mundingburra. The structure cost approximately £100 and was funded by parishioner contributions. Between 1902 and 1945, the bell tower served the Anglican community faithfully. It marked services, celebrations, and solemn events for over four decades.

However, by May 1945, serious structural concerns were noted. A cathedral record stated:

"The bell was hung properly and in theory capable of being rung fully, although the tall wooden tower in which it

was mounted had stood for years and was full of white ants [termites]."

Around 1947, just two years later, the tower gave way. Without human intervention, it collapsed naturally onto the tennis court below. A witness recalled:

"It just subsided on its own... with a doleful dong."

By 18 June 1949, during a scheduled working bee, Mr Williams advised that Mr Brazier had assessed the remaining structure and warned it would likely last no more than another three months. That prompted the final clearing of all remnants.
